



Examples of hard activities

DESCRIPTION: 'Hard' activities are generally either infrastructure based measures or financial instruments. The table shows sample 'hard' activities.

Activities
Active travel
End of trip facilities for cyclists and walkers (showers, lockers, changing rooms, towels, hair driers, drying rooms).
Improvements to the 'last mile' pedestrian and cycle access: direct routes, well signed, well lit, suitable for all users, clear of obstructions, safe and secure.
Cycle parking facilities for visitors.
New pedestrian and cycle access points to the site/building.
Provision of signage/wayfinding for all pedestrian and cycling routes.
Provision of bicycle maintenance stations – tools for fixing bikes.
Provision of pool bikes.
Business travel
Install video conferencing facilities as an alternative to face-to-face meetings.
Reduce number of fleet vehicles.
Car parking
Allocation system for car parking spaces – encouraging multiple occupancy vehicles and maintain sufficient spaces for those with mobility impairments.
Charge for on-site car parking spaces from post-tax salary.
Occasional staff parking permits that are limited to a reduced number of days per year (eg. 90 days/year).
Reduced parking spaces available for single occupancy vehicles.

Activities

Motorcycles and scooters

Designated parking spaces for scooters and motorcycles.

Public transport

Funded shuttle bus to transport employees to railway station late at night.

Subsidy or financial benefit for travelling by non-car modes of transport (eg. provide Opal cards to staff).

Real time public transport arrival and departure boards in entry/exit lobbies of building/s.

Reducing the need to travel

On-site facilities – child care, gym, dry cleaning service, convenience store.

Remote co-working spaces.

Single occupancy vehicle trips

Designated priority car share spaces on site with monitored compliance (ie. for GoGet cars or people who carpool)

Funded Guaranteed Ride Home service for those choosing to car share for their commute.

Consolidate deliveries using vans or trucks; consider using walking/cycling couriers for ad-hoc deliveries.

Travel plan management

Revenue from charging for parking spaces used to fund Travel Plan measures.
