Delays expected on Warringah Freeway

Major delays are expected on the **Warringah Freeway** over the holiday period from **26 December 2023** until **26 January 2024**. If you have staff commuting during this time, consider advising them to commute via the train, Metro or ferry if they are able.

Use **Trip Planner** to plan your journey.

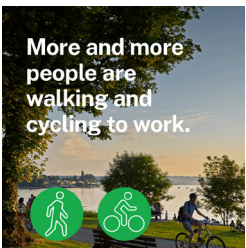

If you live close enough to work, pick a day with nice weather and get your workout completed on the way to work by walking or cycling. Rozelle Parklands opened on 17 December. The new walking and cycling paths provide safe and accessible connections to existing active transport routes to the city via Anzac Bridge, Annandale via the Crescent Overpass and to Drummoyne, the Bay Run and the Rozelle Bay Light Rail Station. Rozelle Parklands to Town Hall in the city is approximately a 15-minute ride or 45-minute walk.

Buses replacing trains on the T3 Line

As part of the Sydney Metro City and Southwest project, rail upgrade works are required on the **T3 Bankstown Line**. You may wish to share the following information with your employees who currently use the T3 line as part of their commute so they may be prepared as they return to work after Christmas.

Train replacement bus services T

From 27 December to 25 January, buses replace trains between **Lidcombe** and **Sydenham**.
 Some days, buses also replace trains between **Cabramatta** and **Bankstown**.
 *1AT3 operates only between 6.30am and 9.30am, Monday to Friday (excluding public holidays).
 **14T3 and 15T3 only operate from 23 December 2023 to 4 January 2024 and from 13 to 14 January between Bankstown and Cabramatta.

Summer track works will impact customers using the T3 train line. Buses replace trains on the T3 line between some stations from **23 December 2023** to **25 January 2024**.
